


CO-OPERATIVES, KEY STAKEHOLDERS OF THE FRENCH ECONOMY

2022 was an exceptional year, marked by both a strong economic upturn and high inflation; cooperatives once again illustrated their key role as stakeholders of the French economy.

The 22,410 cooperatives maintained or developed employment, representing almost 1.3 million jobs, and generated a total turnover of €381 billion (+15.5% in two years). They are present in both urban and rural areas. 77% of the head offices of the 100 largest cooperatives are located outside Paris.

THE COOPERATIVE "PURPOSE"

The framework law of 10 September, 1947, concerning the cooperative status, amended by the law of 31 July, 2014, on the social and solidarity economy, is based on the international principles of the cooperative model.


According to the International Cooperative Alliance, a cooperative is an "autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social and cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly owned and democratically controlled enterprise".

THE 7 COOPERATIVE PRINCIPLES



MEMBERSHIP DEPENDS UPON THE COMPANY PROJECT

A person or a company may hold shares in different cooperatives, given the diversity of the services proposed by cooperatives and the number of different forms they can take. This means there are several types of membership. Governance models vary significantly depending on whether the members are legal entities (companies or public authorities), private individuals, users or employees (or both) of the cooperative. They are classed into "families" of cooperatives, governed by specific laws and resulting in different economic models.
